Our Mission

Raah Foundation is a Non Profit organization working to improve the quality of life and well-being of underprivileged and indigenous communities through water security, sustainable livelihoods while addressing the issues of climate change.



The image represents women carrying water back from the wells Raah Foundation built.

Our research and estimates indicate that women save an impressive 1000 to 1500 hours per year, translating to a **daily time savings of 3-4 hours**. What's even more remarkable is that nearly all women reported **improved health**, thanks to reduced **physical labor** and **enhanced hygiene** facilitated by year-round access to water.

12 years - What a truly amazing and fulfilling journey. What started as a vision - a passionate seed is now a fast growing, healthy and nourished tree giving shade to a few thousand people otherwise struggling in the hot sun of life. In the past few years while growing organically, we also focussed on building a robust venture by putting in place systems, processes and investing in people. At this juncture we are so reminded of this beautiful quote by Vaclav Havel : "Vision is not enough, it must be combined with venture. It is not enough to stare up the steps; we must also step up the stairs". We are now in four talukas (blocks) of Maharashtra and are so proud of the 50 odd team members who are passionately driving the change.

Our water program has consolidated into a strong, replicable model that is channelising a holistic growth and development of our communities. The UN recognition validated our efforts and has of course increased our responsibility. We are expanding our climate smart farming program. We now have over 1500 farmers growing food forests on 1500 plus acres and their tribe is growing every year. Our food forest program is a unique combination of income generation and climate action. Likewise very successful programs on floriculture, drip irrigated vegetable farming, zero input naturally grown monsoon vegetables and crops and rice & millets continue to expand each year. New pilots are introduced every year and successful ones are scaled. The turmeric pilot was hugely encouraging and we are now experimenting with dragon fruit and are excited about it.

Our tribal women entrepreneurs embraced digital tools to track their business and learnt financial literacy skills to become more resilient. Our dream of starting a state of the art skill training centre came to fruition and it is so satisfying to see underprivileged youth successfully completing the program and finding a dignified employment. Climate action program got a tail wind and is flying high. We are working on Phase I of forestation project which will create 525 acres of forest of barren hills of western Nashik. This is part of our endeavour to a-forest 15,000 acres of denuded hills and lands in the catchment area of the Godavari river in Nashik, the second largest river in India.

We are super excited and prepared for the coming decade and this year our entire leadership team huddled together and drafted "Mission 2030" which is an ambitious blueprint to quadruple our efforts to amplify our scale and our impact and the value we bring to the communities. We and our team are extremely well aligned and committed to making this world a little better and a lot happier..

- Successfully implementing Blended finance models - a model that promotes ₹ for ₹ philanthropy
- Expanding to three geographic locations (talukas/ blocks)
- Expanding Climate Action work in the ecologically sensitive catchment of the Godavari river.
- Starting Skill Training vertical for underprivileged youths.
- Launching mission 2030 while aligning with the UN Sustainable Development Goals

Water

Streamlined water work into three parts - work on surface water enhancement, on ground water table improvement and on water usage & a demand lens by catalysing people around cooperatives to ensure water use efficiency.



Sustainable Livelihoods: Climate Smart Farming

After a successful pilot on turmeric, started another pilot on dragon fruit known as a resilient crop. Our flagship food forest and other projects continue growing impacting over 2000 small & marginal farmers directly.



Sustainable Livelihoods: Skill Training

The first centre was inaugurated at Dadar to provide skill training for employment in service sector to urban poor youths. The program provides guaranteed employment. The program has enormous potential and will be expanded soon to other locations.



Sustainable Livelihoods: for Women

In Jawhar & Mokhada: focus was on digital literacy & financial inclusion to ensure women got better grip on their micro businesses to become more confident that supports scale up.

In Pen the product based livelihoods project was further strengthened and expanded. The focus is first on identifying the market & then moving backwards to teaching the relevant skill to the women.



Climate Action

The program was consolidated after an elaborate stakeholder engagement that led to a strategic focus on rejuvenating and reviving the barren & degraded land in the upstream catchment of Godavari river in Nashik.

This involved planting 45,000 saplings on 163 acres in the first phase. The plan for next five years is to work extensively over 15,000 acres.

Partnership with the Government:

This year also saw a successful collaboration with the District Administration and Forest Department as well as multiple Gram Panchayats. There is also a liaisoning with other organisations working on environment in Nashik.

We are on a mission of creating a better and dignified world for some of the poorest communities that are stuck in intergenerational intertwined layers of poverty. We are moving closer to our mission - thanks to amazing passionate partners, donors and an incredible team.












Partnership with the Government :


